THE MISSION


THE SAN MIGUEL SCHOOL is an independent Catholic Lasallian middle school for young men of families in Camden with limited financial means whose educational needs are not being met. As a Gospel-centered school, the dignity and giftedness of each student is recognized and nurtured within a supportive community of staff and parents. Its programs provide the necessary academic, spiritual, and social skills needed to be successful learners and responsible citizens.

THE VISION

EVER SINCE the first Lasallian schools opened in the late 1600s under the direction of Saint John Baptist de La Salle, patron saint of teachers, the hallmark of a Lasallian education is to recognize that each student is unique and has something significant to contribute to society. It is the teachers' mission to help the student discover and cultivate these gifts. The educational mission of the Brothers of the Christian Schools invites us to have our eyes open before the inequalities created by our society and to be creative in our response to new needs as they arise.

THE NAME OF THE SCHOOL

THE SAN MIGUEL SCHOOL of Camden is named in honor of Miguel Febres Cordero, a sainted Brother of the Christian Schools who lived in Ecuador from 1854 to 1910. He was a gifted teacher, scholar, poet, and educator revered for his care and concern for his students. He was canonized by Pope John Paul II on 21 October 1984.

The Birth of a Legacy

IN THE 17TH CENTURY Saint John Baptist de La Salle (1651-1719) organized a group of teachers into a religious community he called the Brothers of the Christian Schools. Over the next thirty years De La Salle opened several schools throughout France. Historic records indicated that: “Monsieur de La Salle had the idea of setting up gratuitous schools where the children of workmen and the poor would learn reading, writing and arithmetic and would receive a Christian education through the catechisms and other forms of instruction appropriate for forming good Christians.”



The year was 1679, and De La Salle was busy balancing family affairs, his spiritual work with the Sisters of the Child Jesus, and his canonry at the Cathedral of Reims. One day John Baptist de La Salle met schoolmaster Adrien Nyel, a friend of a distant relative, at the doors of the convent of the Sisters of the Child Jesus. This chance encounter began De La Salle's involvement in starting free schools for poor boys in Reims.

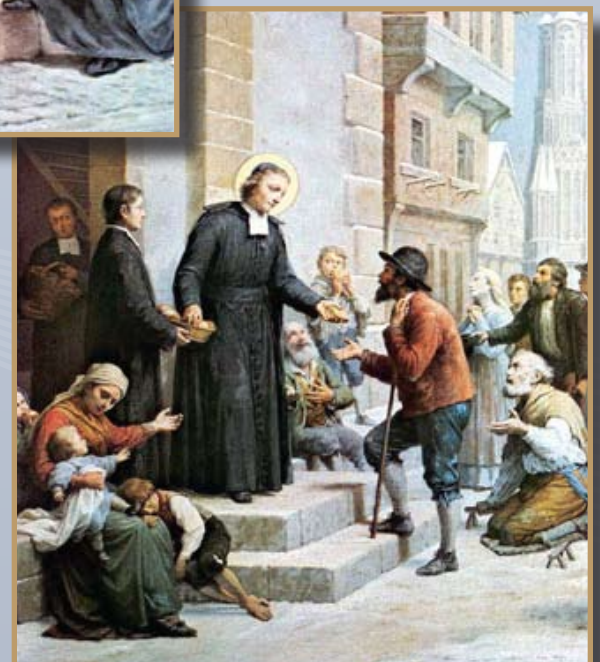


De La Salle's reluctant “yes” opened the door to creating a new system of education that would revolutionize the educational system during this time in France.

These educational innovations under La Salle's guidance would eventually lead to the establishment of the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, the men who would run these schools throughout France and eventually reach to the ends of the world during the early part of the 20th century.

In solidarity with his Brothers and the many who suffered during the harsh winter and famine of 1683-4, La Salle distributed all his wealth in the form of food and clothing to those who suffered the most during this time. For those who could not get out to De La Salle's house, he would go to their house to ensure the necessities of life were met in that household.

This emptying of self would be the first of many graced moments in La Salle's life that would establish a bedrock foundation of schools devoted to providing a Christian and human education to the youth, especially those who are poor.



Heirs of This Legacy

THE CHALLENGE to provide a relevant and efficacious education is as old as humanity itself, and we must continually seek new instruments to meet this challenge. La Salle's innovative educational methodologies would be the seeds for the modern Catholic education system that would spread to the four corners of the earth benefitting millions.

THE SAN MIGUEL SCHOOL of Camden's mission to break the cycles of poverty and violence reflect the founding mission of The Brothers of the Christian Schools. By providing a gratuitous, human and Christian education, our students find their rightful and significant place in society. We ultimately prepare our students to be transformational leaders who are not afraid to challenge the structures of society and to make hope alive in the 21st century.

Thanks for being called to our work here in Camden. God bless you for your continued generosity and unceasing prayers.

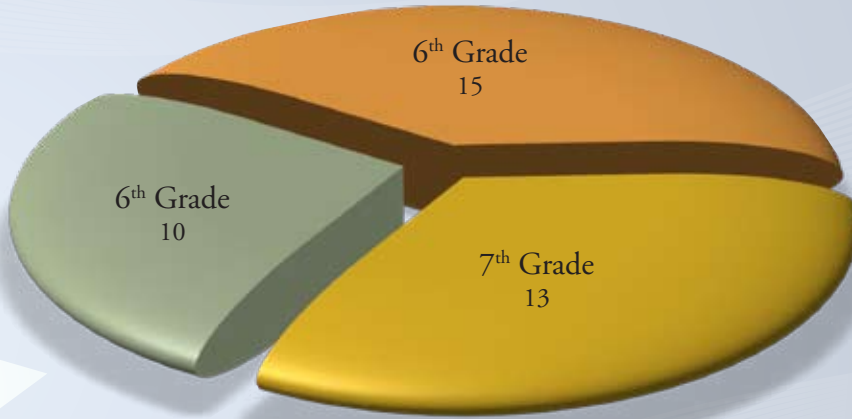

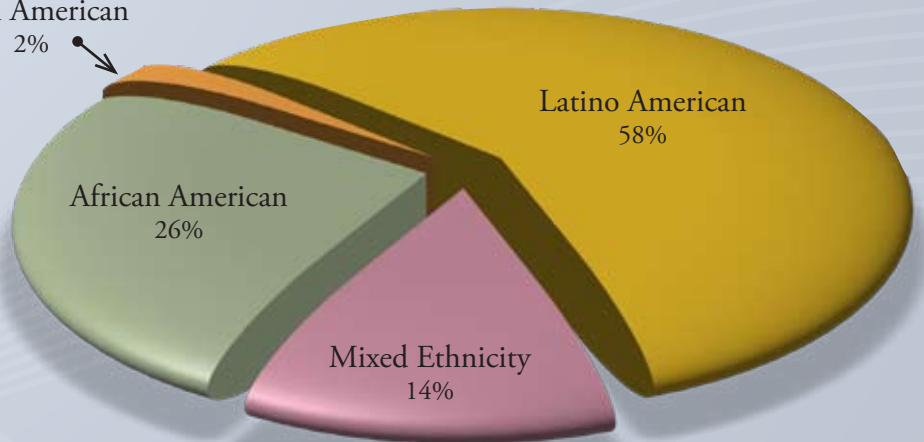

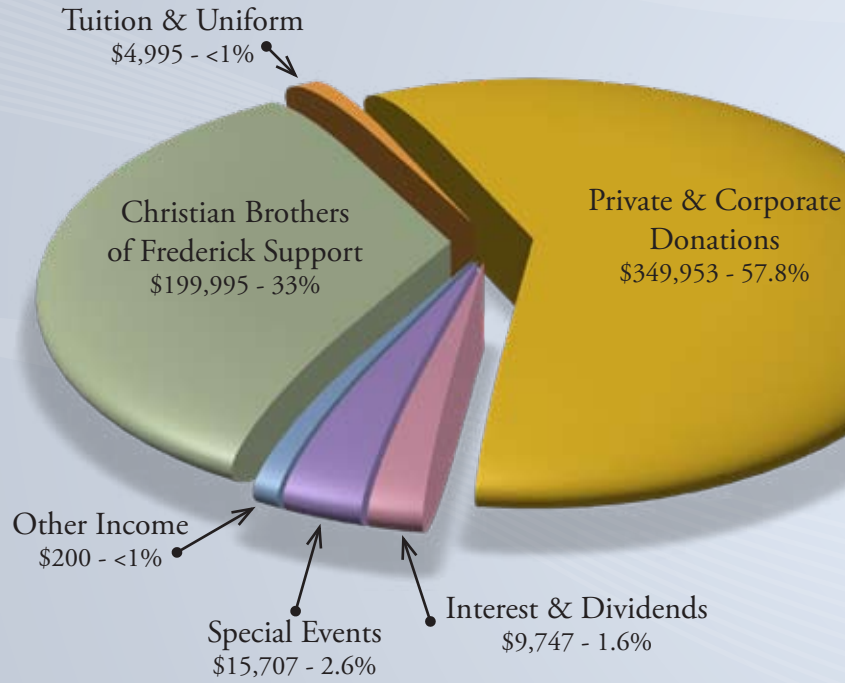

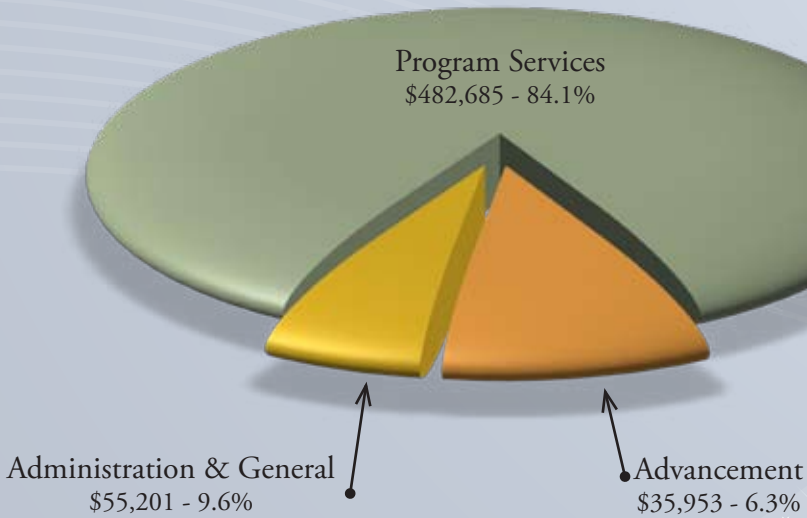
